Flushable vs. Dispersible:




Just because something is labeled "flushable" doesn't mean that it is also dispersible. Toilet paper, a flushable product, will break down and pass through the sewer system... "flushable wipes" will NOT!

Consumers are led to believe some products are safe to flush due to erroneous product labeling.



The Problem:

Nondispersible wipes accumulate in the sewerlines and private laterals, causing blockages that are costly for both homeowners and municipalities.

YOU are the solution. Bring complaints about poor labeling of products to the attention of the manufacturers...


Educate your friends and family about what can and cannot be flushed.
