

Project Overview

- The Adler Chapel, a 100-year-old Egyptian Revivalist structure, will be rehabilitated into a Visitor & Jewish History Center to serve cultural, educational, and spiritual tourism in Erie County.
- Location: The Adler Chapel is located at Ahavas Achim Cemetery, A New York State Historic Landmark and National Historic Register Landmark.
- Address: 532 Pine Ridge Heritage Blvd, Cheektowaga, NY 14225
- Size: 600 sq. ft.
- Project Cost: \$500,000
- County Share Requested: \$100,000

Statement of Need

- Adler Chapel restoration will honor Jewish immigrant history and Buffalo's architectural heritage.
- The project will accommodate increased tourism and engagement with historic Jewish cemeteries along with an overflow of tourism that is occurring due to EXPLORE BUFFALO TOURS at the Jewish Cemeteries along with Spiritual and Religious pilgrimages.
- Rehabilitating the Chapel supports volunteer preservation efforts and expands community education.

Scope of Work

- Full roof, exterior and foundation restoration
- Window replacements and structural stabilization
- HVAC and Electrical installation
- Water/sewer utility connections for genderneutral restrooms
- Interior renovations for Welcome Room and Exhibition Space

Project Readiness

- Architectural and engineering plans complete
- Site control secured via purchase agreement
- Local civil engineering, architectural, and surveying professionals engaged
- 6-month construction timeline from project start

Budget Summary

- Total Project Cost: \$408,000
- County Share: \$100,000
- Private & Philanthropic Support: \$308,000-of which \$200,000 has been raised (\$73,800 was a grant from the WNYPPAB) –WNY Power Authority
- If Erie County supports this project we have a matching donor

Infrastructure costs include:

- Septic & Water Line Installation: \$125,500
- Design, Surveying, and Architecture: \$29,000+
- Interior Buildout and Accessibility: Remaining balance
