

COVID-19 Data Update

Week ending October 22, 2022

All data are provisional.

1,311 new COVID-19 cases were recorded for the week ending October 22, 2022. This is nearly the same as the previous week's total of 1,300 cases. These data do not include at-home tests. The weekly COVID-19 positivity rate remained ~12.0%. 10,800 overall reported COVID-19 diagnostic tests were nearly the same as the previous week's total of 10,815 tests.

7-day case rate per 100,000 persons was 137.4, also nearly the same as the previous week's rate of 136.2. Erie County remains in a "medium" COVID-19 Community Level per CDC indicators. And, Erie County remains in "high" transmission per CDC community transmission metrics.

Buffalo city COVID-19 cases comprised 30.4% of new COVID-19 cases this past week. (Buffalo city population is 29.2% of all Erie County residents).

Erie County COVID-19 Wastewater Surveillance Data: See Figure 3. The most recent COVID-19 wastewater surveillance data through October 20, 2022 showed SARS-CoV-2 viral particles in the top 60-79% of samples collected since 12/1/21 within the Big Sister, Bird Island and City of Tonawanda sewersheds. Amherst, Kenmore-Tonawanda, Lackawanna and Southtowns were in the 40-59% category.

Also through October 20, 2022, over the past two weeks the Amherst, Big Sister, City of Tonawanda, Kenmore-Tonawanda and Southtowns sewersheds showed a 99-10% decrease; Bird Island and Lackawanna shoed a 9-0% decrease. See https://www.erie.gov/covid19-wastewater

Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Age Group and Gender (March 2020-present)



Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Age Group (October 16-22, 2022)









