- 2. Cartridge cases are routinely evaluated for entry in the NIBIN database; therefore requests solely for this operation are not necessary.
- 3. If specific item numbers are not indicated in a request, or if components are recovered from multiple locations, Firearms Section personnel will select which fired ammunition components to compare based on available case information and quality of evidence.
- 4. Microscopic comparison requests involving multiple components recovered from the same shooting scene will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis following initial analysis for class characteristics.
- 5. Incomplete or unclear requests may require clarification before analysis begins.
