Dawn has been honored as one of 32 Buffalo Black Achievers award winners in 2017 and one of 10 women honored as part of the third annual "Women Making History in Erie County" celebration in 2004.

She also has won an Associated Press award for editorials highlighting efforts by the Families of Flight 3407 to improve airline safety and has been recognized by the Preservation League of New York State for a decade-long series of editorials in support of historic preservation tax credits.

Dawn is a graduate of the University of Maryland, College Park and the daughter of James and Marie B. Bracely. She has been with The Buffalo News for 23 years.

CEO OF VISION MULTIMEDIA AND OWNE OF WUFO 1080 AM RADIO AND WIGO 1570 AM

Sheila L. Brown, Manager and Principal Owner of Vision Multimedia Group, LLC is a visionary leader, two-time author, and CEO of a qualified Woman Business Enterprise (MWBE). Brown is also the CEO and President of the WUFO Black Radio History Collective. She is a lifetime member of the Pilgrim Baptist Church and has three children with her husband Kenneth Brown.

Sheila started in entry-level sales WUFO Radio Station and worked her way up to CEO. In 2013 Brown fulfilled her longtime dream of owning

broadcasting station after purchasing WUFO Radio Station and becoming the youngest African-American female in the country to do so. Using her radio platform, she initiated several successful events including the Black Music Month Conference and events to promote women-owned businesses. She also created two on-air programs - The Author's Academy and SLB Book Review as well as a program raising awareness of local business and entertainment. Sheila is currently working on her first movie, The Barrington Brown Story.

Sheila has received many awards including the media award from the Black Achievers (2014), recognized by Buffalo Business First as CEO of the largest women-owned business (2017) and named on the Top 125 Power Women List (2019 & 2020), Atlanta Radio & Record Award (2020). In 2022, Brown was inducted as the first African American into the Buffalo Broadcaster Association. In addition to being a CEO she enjoys dancing, shopping, going to the hair salon and enjoying Sunday dinners with her husband and a nice glass of wine

Prior to joining Buffalo Toronto Public Media in August 2021, Calderone held leadership positions with Spotify, VH1, and MTV and served as a consultant for media companies. Calderone was the Global Head of Content Partnership/Global Head of Studios for Spotify, pioneering the company's expansion into new areas of audio and video content, including podcasts and mobile-friendly video series. For 10 years (2005-2015), Calderone was President of VH1/Viacom, during which he led the organization into the Top 5 cable channels for adults 18-49 years old.

He was Executive Vice President of Music & Talent Programming at MTV and MTV2/Viacom from 1998 to 2005, during which he introduced new programming such as Total Request Live, MT-VIcon, and music documentaries. He also served as Chairman of Save the Music from 2005 to 2015.

After earning a Bachelor of Arts in Broadcasting and Communication from SUNY Buffalo State, Calderone worked in radio as on-air talent, program director, and operations manager before moving on to radio consulting with Jacobs Media. Calderone was elected to the Buffalo Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Buffalo Music Hall of Fame in 2014. He also received an honorary Doctorate from SUNY Buffalo State in 2008.

As well as being a feature columnist for the Buffalo Criterion News, Frank is a trustee for the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library Board, owner of Greater Buffalo Bail-bond Agency, and
