



Now that we're all back to work, we wanted to follow up with you on the set of information gathering worksheets that was discussed at the Hazard Mitigation Planning Partnership Kickoff Meetings on November 18th and 19th. You can find the worksheets for download on the project website, here: https://www.eriecountynyhmp.com/municipal-information/.

Here is some information for you as you work through the worksheets:

1. You are not alone in completing the worksheets. You should work with a team of officials

from your jurisdictions to fill them out. The Worksheet Outline lists the officials who might be involved in filling out each one. You will also be assigned a planner from our consultant team who will reach out to offer assistance.

- 2. More information is better. Even if you see a yes/no question, any details you can provide will make our plan stronger.
- 3. It's best to fill them out in Word rather than printing them out and writing in your answers, so that the rows give you enough room to answer, but if filling them out by hand is easiest for you, that's fine too.
- 4. Worksheet 1 Evaluation of Identified Hazards and Risks Please note how your municipality's vulnerability has changed, and identify any additional hazards you think we should examine. Also, please provide some details on how the events listed impacted your municipality, and identify any other hazard events that impacted you. On the last page, tell us about any problems that hazards present in your community, or anything that you'd like to address in this planning process.

5. Worksheet 2 – Capability Assessment and Integration

- a. Planning and Regulatory Capability
 - i. Identify any local plans and/or regulations that you have in effect in your municipality. For any that you say you have, you must fill in the entire row. Provide a code citation. For regulations, that's the local law number or chapter of your municipal code, and the date. For plans, we need the formal title of the plan and the date it was last updated.
 - ii. In the comments, describe how the regulation or plan helps reduce longterm vulnerability. For instance, if you have zoning, does it limit development in hazard areas like the floodplain?
- b. Administrative and Technical Capability
 - i. Identify what staff members or technical expertise you have on staff (full time, part time, or volunteer for your municipality), or who you have access to through the county or another organization. If you have that resource, identify who it is by organization/position, not by a person's name.
- c. Community Classifications
 - i. Your code enforcement officer should know your BCEGS rating.
 - ii. Your fire department might know your ISO Fire Protection Class, if none of your municipal officials know.
 - iii. There are links on the last page for finding out your BCEGS rating and Fire Protection Class, as well.
- 6. Worksheet 3 NFIP Floodplain Administrator Questionnaire –your floodplain administrator will lead the charge on filling this one out, but may need help from other officials (zoning, codes enforcement, etc.). Again, more information is better. Really describe your municipality's programs, rather than just saying yes/no.
- 7. Worksheet 4 Mitigation Action Review Worksheet see below
- 8. Worksheet 5 New Development and Building Permits identify the number of permits issued in your municipality in each of the last several years (by occupancy), the number of those permits that were for development in the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) the floodplain, any major development in the last 5 years, and any known or proposed major development on the horizon. For major development, we're looking for any commercial or

industrial development, and any apartment buildings, subdivisions, etc. You don't need to list every single residential structure that was built.

9. Worksheet 6 – Shelters, Evacuation Routes, Temporary Housing, and Long-Term Housing –

- a. Evacuation Routes what are the main routes you would use to evacuate your municipality, particularly from a flood?
- b. Sheltering Needs provide all of the information requested for each facility that has been identified as a potential shelter.
- c. Temporary Housing the State requires that we identify where we could place FEMA trailers or other temporary housing to help people displaced by an emergency. List any parks, open lots, RV campgrounds, etc. where you could theoretically place temporary housing. The sites do not need to be ready to accept them right now, but if you identify a site that isn't ready yet, the plan will have an action to meet the requirements.
- d. Permanent Housing the State also requires that we also identify potential sites that can be developed with new permanent housing. Of course, it depends on the landowner being willing to sell, a developer being willing to build new housing, and other factors, but identify any targeted growth areas or sites that have already been identified for future development in your municipality.

Worksheet 4 is different for each jurisdiction, as it capture information about the actions that your municipality included in the 2015 plan. <u>The Erie County Water Authority, Village of Farnham, and</u> <u>Town of Wales do not have a Worksheet 4</u>, because there were no jurisdiction-specific actions in the 2015 plan for those jurisdictions.

- Brief Summary of the Original Problem the 2015 HMP did not identify the problem being solved for each action, but if you know what problem was to be solved by each, enter it.
- Status (In Progress, Ongoing, No Progress, Complete) choose the status of the action. If you haven't gotten the project done (or even started) in the last five years, that's OK- we just need to know the status.
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If you need the worksheets emailed to you, or sent via hard copy, please let me know.

Please work with your colleagues to complete and return the worksheets by December 22, 2020.

While you're thinking about the HMP, why not provide some additional information on the hazards that impact our communities? Please go to our online problem mapping tool (<u>https://arcg.is/9bzzr</u>) to identify places where hazards affect your municipality.

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Good afternoon!

We hope you enjoyed the Thanksgiving holiday with your families. Now that we're all back to work, we wanted to follow up with you on the set of information gathering worksheets that was discussed at the Hazard Mitigation Planning Partnership Kickoff Meetings on November 18th and 19th. You can find the worksheets for download on the project website, here:

https://www.eriecountynyhmp.com/municipal-information/.

Here is some information for you as you work through the worksheets:

- 1. You are not alone in completing the worksheets. You should work with a team of officials from your jurisdictions to fill them out. The Worksheet Outline lists the officials who might be involved in filling out each one. You will also be assigned a planner from our consultant team who will reach out to offer assistance.
- 2. More information is better. Even if you see a yes/no question, any details you can provide will make our plan stronger.
- 3. It's best to fill them out in Word rather than printing them out and writing in your answers, so that the rows give you enough room to answer, but if filling them out by hand is easiest for you, that's fine too.
- 4. Worksheet 1 Evaluation of Identified Hazards and Risks Please note how your municipality's vulnerability has changed, and identify any additional hazards you think we should examine. Also, please provide some details on how the events listed impacted your municipality, and identify any other hazard events that impacted you. On the last page, tell us about any problems that hazards present in your community, or anything that you'd like to address in this planning process.

5. Worksheet 2 – Capability Assessment and Integration

- a. Planning and Regulatory Capability
 - i. Identify any local plans and/or regulations that you have in effect in your municipality. For any that you say you have, you must fill in the entire row. Provide a code citation. For regulations, that's the local law number or chapter of your municipal code, and the date. For plans, we need the formal title of the plan and the date it was last updated.
 - ii. In the comments, describe how the regulation or plan helps reduce longterm vulnerability. For instance, if you have zoning, does it limit development in hazard areas like the floodplain?
- b. Administrative and Technical Capability
 - i. Identify what staff members or technical expertise you have on staff (full time, part time, or volunteer for your municipality), or who you have access to through the county or another organization. If you have that resource, identify who it is by organization/position, not by a person's name.
- c. Community Classifications
 - i. Your code enforcement officer should know your BCEGS rating.
 - ii. Your fire department might know your ISO Fire Protection Class, if none of your municipal officials know.
 - iii. There are links on the last page for finding out your BCEGS rating and Fire Protection Class, as well.
- 6. Worksheet 3 NFIP Floodplain Administrator Questionnaire –your floodplain administrator will lead the charge on filling this one out, but may need help from other officials (zoning,

codes enforcement, etc.). Again, more information is better. Really describe your municipality's programs, rather than just saying yes/no.

- 7. Worksheet 4 Mitigation Action Review Worksheet see below
- 8. Worksheet 5 New Development and Building Permits identify the number of permits issued in your municipality in each of the last several years (by occupancy), the number of those permits that were for development in the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) the floodplain, any major development in the last 5 years, and any known or proposed major development on the horizon. For major development, we're looking for any commercial or industrial development, and any apartment buildings, subdivisions, etc. You don't need to list every single residential structure that was built.
- 9. Worksheet 6 Shelters, Evacuation Routes, Temporary Housing, and Long-Term Housing
 - a. Evacuation Routes what are the main routes you would use to evacuate your municipality, particularly from a flood?
 - b. Sheltering Needs provide all of the information requested for each facility that has been identified as a potential shelter.
 - c. Temporary Housing the State requires that we identify where we could place FEMA trailers or other temporary housing to help people displaced by an emergency. List any parks, open lots, RV campgrounds, etc. where you could theoretically place temporary housing. The sites do not need to be ready to accept them right now, but if you identify a site that isn't ready yet, the plan will have an action to meet the requirements.
 - d. Permanent Housing the State also requires that we also identify potential sites that can be developed with new permanent housing. Of course, it depends on the landowner being willing to sell, a developer being willing to build new housing, and other factors, but identify any targeted growth areas or sites that have already been identified for future development in your municipality.

Worksheet 4 is different for each jurisdiction, as it capture information about the actions that your municipality included in the 2015 plan. <u>The Erie County Water Authority, Village of Farnham, and</u> <u>Town of Wales do not have a Worksheet 4</u>, because there were no jurisdiction-specific actions in the 2015 plan for those jurisdictions.

- Brief Summary of the Original Problem the 2015 HMP did not identify the problem being solved for each action, but if you know what problem was to be solved by each, enter it.
- Status (In Progress, Ongoing, No Progress, Complete) choose the status of the action. If you haven't gotten the project done (or even started) in the last five years, that's OK- we just need to know the status.
- Evaluation of Success (if project status is complete) these columns are filled in ONLY FOR COMPLETED ACTIONS. If you completed an action, tell us how much it cost, what level of protection it provides (to the 10-year storm, to the 500-year flood, etc.), and describe the benefits it provides in terms of damages avoided or other evidence that it was a successful project.
- In the right-most column, let us know what you want to do with the action.
 - Should it be included in the updated plan or discontinued? If it's no longer relevant, or not specific enough for the updated plan, it can be discontinued.
 - If you want to include it in the updated plan, is the wording OK, or do you want to

update it at all?

- If you discontinued the action, say why.
- On the last page, identify any other actions that you carried out that weren't on the list from the 2015 plan. For instance, did you replace a bridge, update a culvert, update a plan or regulation, etc.? Also include any projects that you know you want to include in the updated plan.

If you need the worksheets emailed to you, or sent via hard copy, please let me know.




