# Erie County Department of Personnel Information for Candidates – Canvass Response and Declination Options

### **Purpose of This Notice**

This document explains what a canvass is, how to respond, and how declinations affect your eligibility on a civil service eligible list.

#### What Is a Canvass?

A canvass is a notice sent to candidates whose names appear on an eligible list when an appointing authority has a vacancy to fill. Responding to a canvass is not an offer of employment but an opportunity to be considered.

#### **How to Respond**

You must respond by the deadline stated in your canvass notice.

Failure to respond will be treated as a declination and your name may be removed from consideration for this or future vacancies.

#### **Declination Options**

You may decline a position for one of the following reasons:

Code Reason		Impact
Α	Insufficient pay	Remain on list; not canvassed again for same salary range at this appointing authority.
В	Duration of employment	Decline a temporary job → still eligible for permanent; decline a permanent job → removed from list.
С	Location	Remain on list but not canvassed again for this appointing authority.
D	Regular part-time (20–39 hrs/wk)	Stay eligible for full-time and regular part-time only.
Е	Part-time (under 20 hrs/wk)	Stay eligible for full-time and regular part-time only.

Code Reason		Impact
F	Work schedule (evenings/weekends)	Will not be certified again for positions with same shift type.
G	Remove my name	Permanently removed from list.
Н	Temporary inability (personal/family issue)	May request reinstatement after 3 months by written request.
1	Medical inability (with documentation)	Must provide physician's note within 2 weeks; reinstatement requires Personnel Officer approval.

## **Important Notes**

Do not resign from your current position until a formal appointment is made.

A canvass does not guarantee employment.
