


Transit-Oriented Development Training for Planning & Zoning Board Members

What is TOD?

Transit-Oriented Development is development that focuses land uses around a transit station or within a transit corridor. TOD occurs within a five to seven minute walk of a transit station, which is about 1/4 mile.
