WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- The property upon which the mobile home is occupied must be located within one of the participating communities listed.
- The mobile home must be owneroccupied, and the household's principal residence.
- The land upon which the mobile home is located must be current with respect to local property taxes.
- The gross household income must not exceed the following income figures.



WHAT FORMS OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ARE AVAILABLE?

Financial assistance is provided as follows:

- Monies are provided as a deferred loan with conversation to a grant following 3 years of occupancy.
- The loan recipient is required to sign a promissory note with Erie County prior to project start-up.
- The maximum assistance is \$5,000.00



HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

- A minimum of two contractors' estimates are required to assume a fair price of work to be done.
- Participants select their own contractor.
- The County trained housing staff will assist in guiding the work that is being done.
