## **SPRING INTO SEED STARTING**

#### Now is a great time to start seeds indoors!

Most vegetable, perennial, and annual plants can be started from seed in your home.

To start your seeds, you will need containers, seed starting mix, and a light source. You can use seedling cell packs, compostable pots, or a variety of small household recyclables. Grow lights are ideal, but a sunny window will also suffice, especially if the seedlings will only be indoors for a short period of time.

As your seedlings begin to grow, they may need to eventually be transplanted into larger containers in order for their roots to continue to expand. This is also a good time to add nutrients to the soil as the seedlings have exhausted their stored food supply and now must uptake nutrients from the soil.

### **ERIE COUNTY SEED LIBRARIES**

Several Erie County Libraries have started "Seed Library" programs. The goal of these programs is to is to build a collection of seeds to share that reflect our culturally diversity, showcase our beautiful native species, and feed our communities with home grown produce.

With your Erie County Library card, you can check out up to 4 seed packets at a time. Seeds are organized alphabetically by common name (vegetables, flowers, and herbs will be in separate drawers) and they will be marked by color for ease of seed saving.

The Seed Library at the Central Library in Downtown Buffalo is located in the Launch Pad section. Seed packets are organized in labeled drawers.

## **PASTA PRIMAVERA RECIPE**

## Ingredients

- 1 cup noodles, uncooked
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 2 cups mixed vegetables (chopped)
- 1 cup tomatoes (chopped)
- 1 tablespoon margarine
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 3 tablespoons Parmesan cheese
- Use your favorite spring vegetables from your garden or local farmers market: kohlrabi, sugar snap peas, carrots, and asparagus

# **Directions**

- Wash hands with soap and water.
- Cook noodles according to package directions.
- While noodles are cooking, heat oil in a skillet.
- Add vegetables and sauté until tender; stir constantly.
- Add tomato and sauté 2 more minutes.
- Toss vegetables with noodles and margarine.
- Add seasonings; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

# Upcoming Events

#### Solar Eclipse April 8, 2024



On April 8, 2024, Western New York and Erie County will experience a total solar eclipse. This occurs when the moon passes between the sun and earth, completely blocking the face of the sun. The sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk.

#### PLAN AHEAD

- Choose a safe location, away from traffic and other hazards; make sure your view is not obstructed by trees, buildings, or signs.
   Be aware of your surroundings, especially if you're in an unfamiliar area.
- Consider carpooling and allow extra time to get to and from your destination.
- Stay informed about traffic patterns. Go to 511wny.org to stay updated.
- Follow local guidance for eclipse viewing. Some areas may have specific rules to ensure public safety.
- Have a communication plan in case congestion causes poor cell reception.

#### SCHOOLS AND BUSINESSES

Many local school districts have cancelled classes for the day. Businesses may have plans to close or to extend their hours.

#### WARNING

Never look directly at the sun without proper eye protection. Looking directly at the sun can cause severe and permanent eye and vision damage. It's important to use ISO-certified eclipse glasses for direct solar observation.

#### STAY HOME IF YOU CAN

Avoid any non-essential travel and try to schedule appointments for another day. Be prepared for emergencies by having a basic first aid kit, emergency contacts, and any necessary medications on hand.

#### VIEW SAFELY

- Use solar viewing glasses that meet ISO 12312-2 standards.
- Check for any damage or scratches on glasses before use, as any defects can compromise their effectiveness.
- Regular sunglasses are not safe for viewing a solar eclipse.
- Supervise children and stop them from looking directly at the sun without protection.
- · Take breaks and give your eyes time to rest.
- Avoid homemade filters.

#### CHECK THE WEATHER

Check the forecast and have an alternate viewing site if your view could be obstructed by clouds. Dress for local conditions.


#### **ENJOY THE MOMENT**


