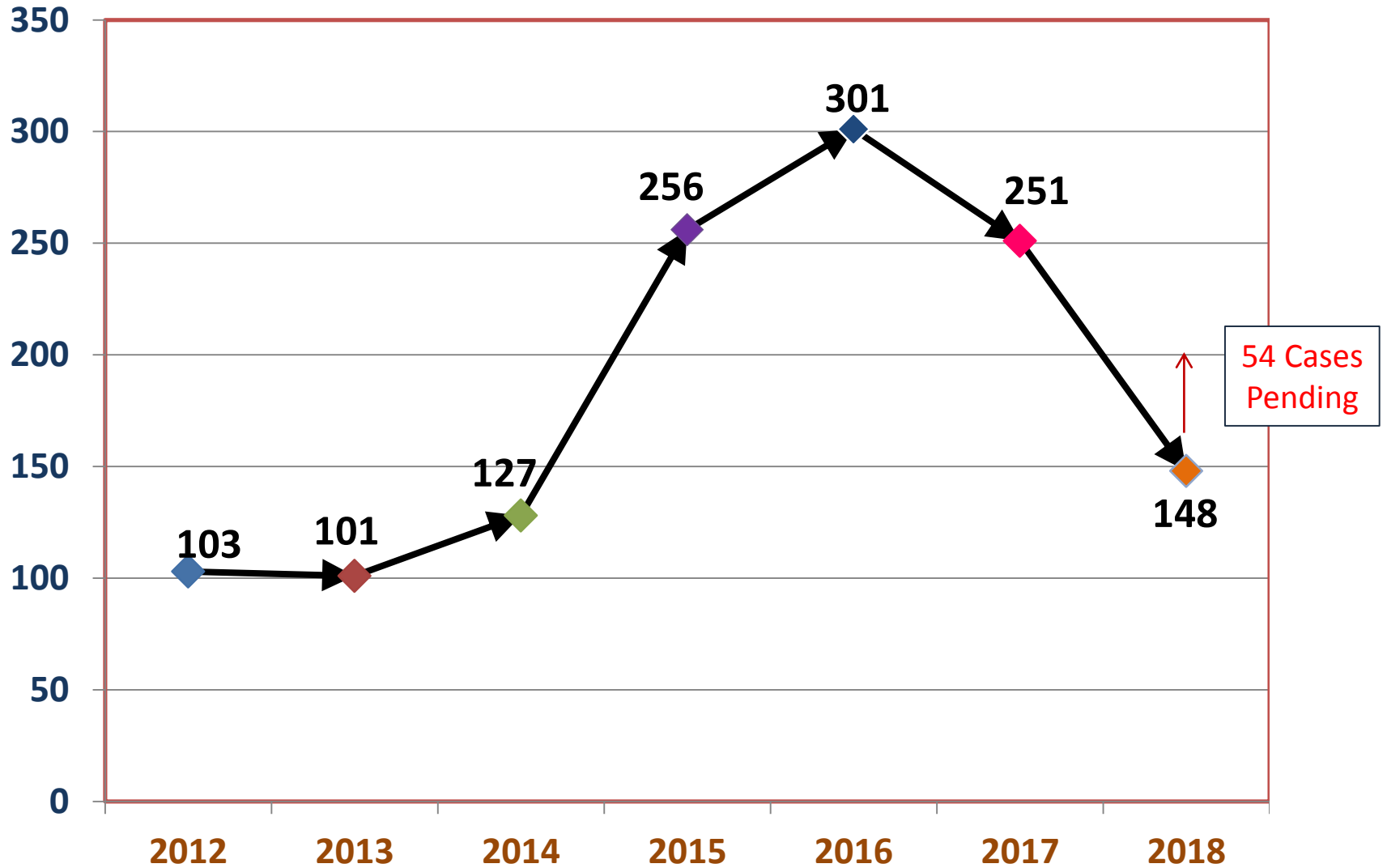

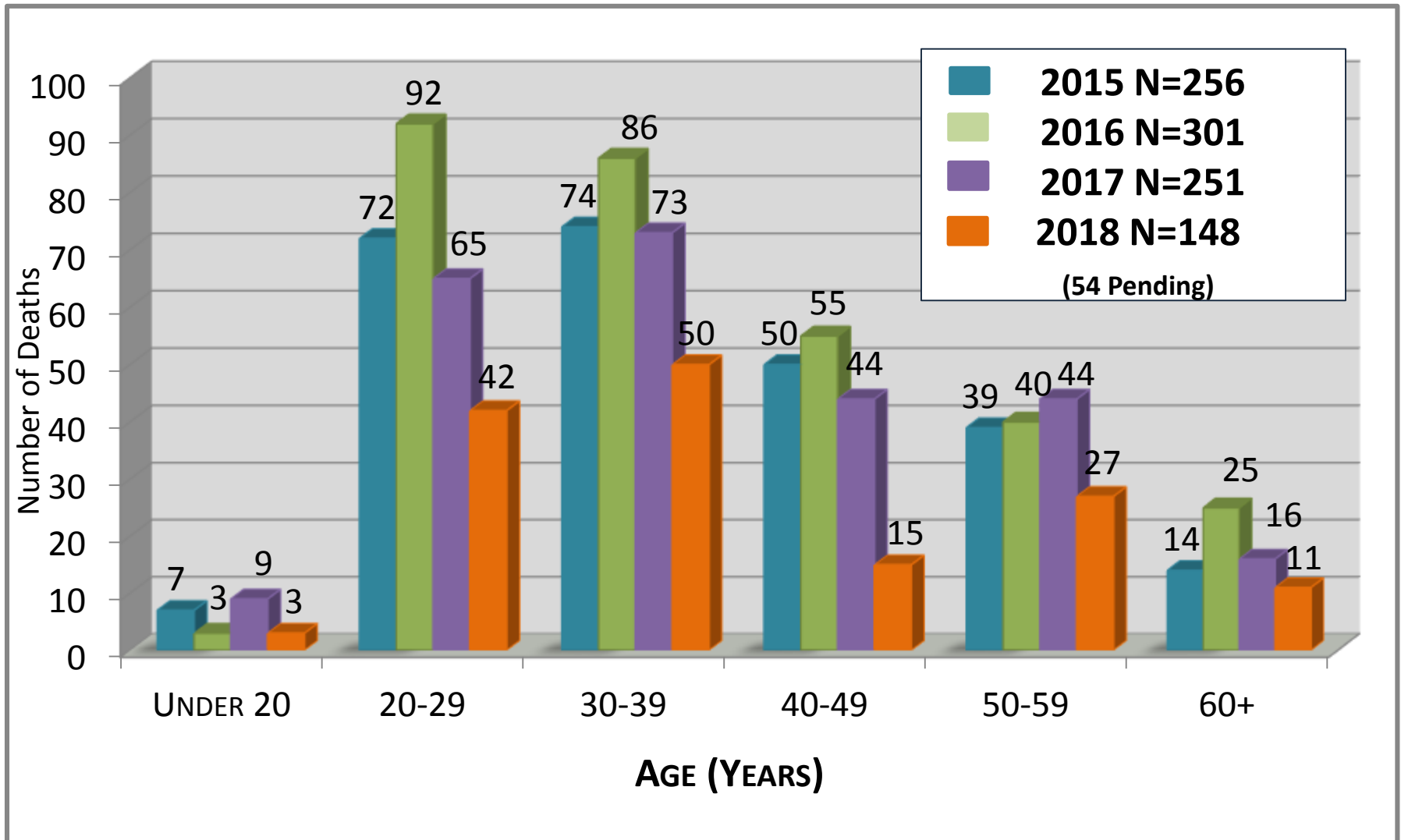

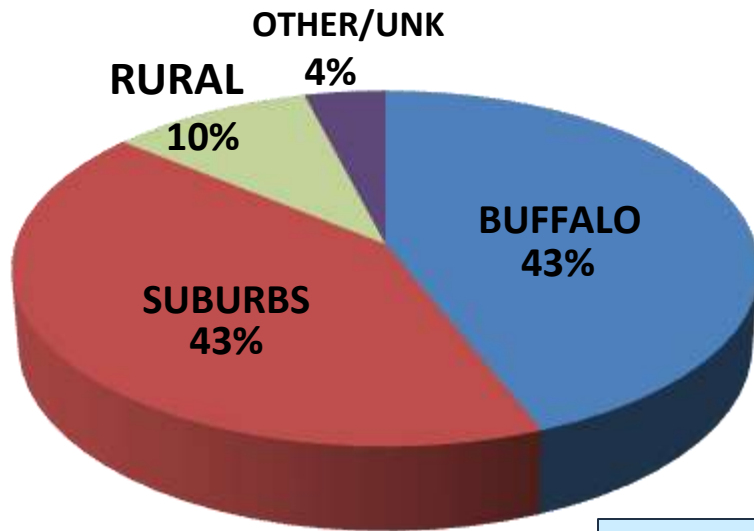

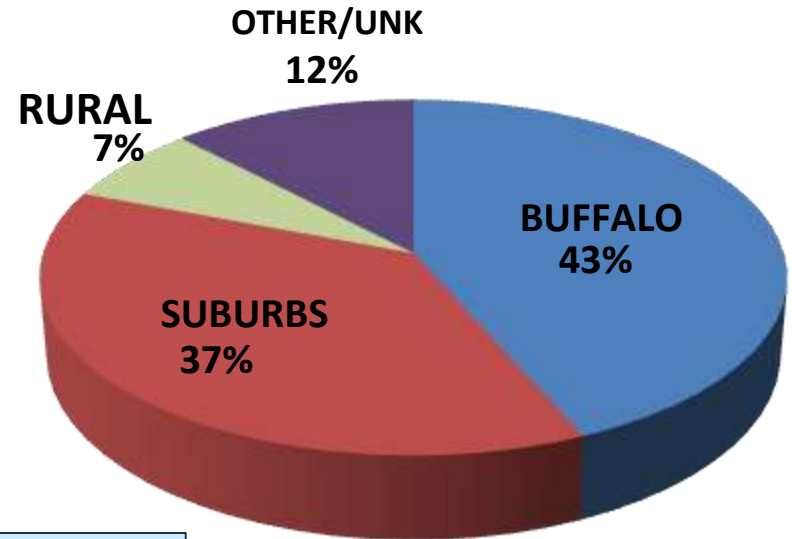


2017 - 2018 ERIE COUNTY OPIOID RELATED DEATHS BY RESIDENCE

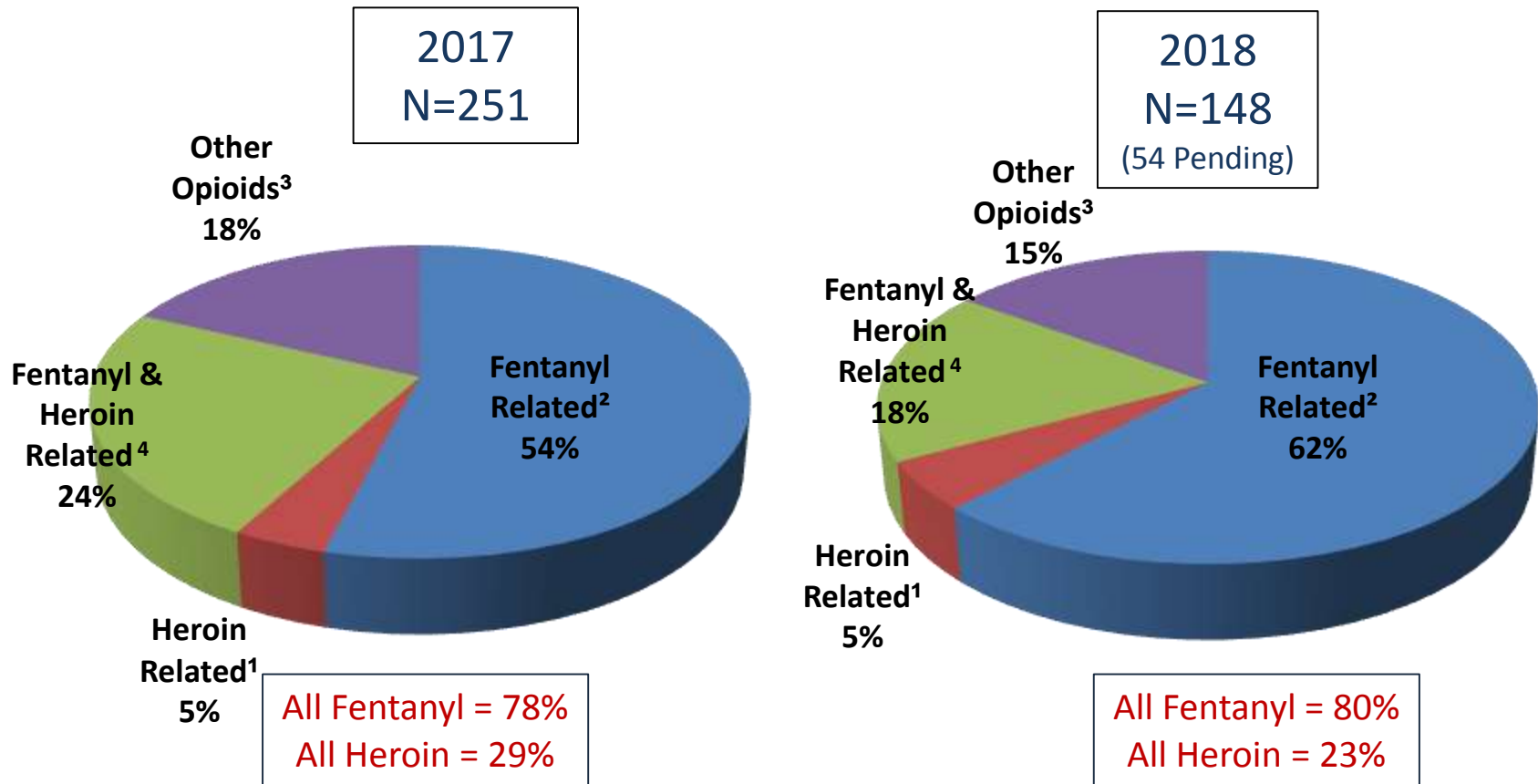

Suboxone “Hub and Spoke” Pilot

- Problem
 - Need more suboxone prescribers in primary care
 - Health system/insurance creates barriers to efficiently providing MAT in primary care
- Potential solution: Pilot Hub and Spoke model for MAT in primary care
 - HUB = UB | MD addictions medicine specialists as mentors and SUD clinics to provide case management, counseling, tox screening
 - Spoke = BMG PCPs
