



2015 – 2023* PERCENT OF OPIOID RELATED DEATHS BY AGE ERIE COUNTY



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






OVERDOSE DASHBOARD PREVIEW

Almost every single day, someone in Erie County dies from an opioid poisoning. Overdose deaths increased during the pandemic, and remain high to the present day. Many drugs are now mixed with fentanyl, a major factor leading to the rise in drug-related Buffalo, this issue affects all parts of Erie deaths. Fentanyl is commonly mixed with cocaine, often without the user's knowledge.




Monthly Overdose Deaths, 2018 to June 2023

Yearly Total of Overdose Deaths, 2015 to 2022



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




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




Fatality Rate of Overdoses in 2023 by Age Group (as of June)

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

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

Winter Preparedness









How could winter weather affect my ability to get to treatment or medications?

Start having conversations with health care providers now about how to manage a short-term (a few days) emergency or something that lasts a week or more.

Build your Circle of Care

Talk to family members, friends and neighbors about how to approach emergencies together – what resources and skills you need, and what gaps you need to fill.

Have phone resources available – numbers for trusted friends, Crisis Services.

Winter Preparedness









Create emergency kits for homes and vehicles.

Include food, water, ways to stay warm, ways to get information, basic first aid supplies.

Don't forget pets and needs for people who may have specific medical needs (mobility aids, oxygen, hearing aids) or dietary needs (infant formula, allergies).

- What to Improve:
 - · Expand on prevention and harm reduction messaging through social media, television, advertisements, radios,
 - o Implement more information about the Opioid Epidemic into all education courses.

- In US Censes, the Methadone Maintenance in Erie county located programs have slightly increased since 2020.
- Methadone Maintenance Waitlist numbers fluctuate overtime.

- SUNY Research Foundation provides evaluation to the practices
- Enhance case management capacity (MOUD services) -> unresolved trauma (substance use disorders, co-occurring illness)

 - o Training, certifications, work experience, and support in securing and maintaining employment to people with lived experience
- . Horizon Health Services got a grant to enhance to screen and identify Hepatitis C (HCV)

Background – The Opioid Epidemic

- Irresponsible practices by the pharmaceutical industry resulted in significant deaths and incalculable harm to families across Erie County.
- Between 2012 and 2021, more than 2,000 Erie County residents died from an opioid-related overdose.
- Executive Order 14, in 2016 created the Erie County Opiate Epidemic Task Force, this created systemic changes that eventually led to a decline in deaths and overdoses overall.
- Unfortunately, after 3 years of declining deaths and overdoses, deaths increased during 2020 and 2021 due to many factors, the primary being isolation and changes in drugs contaminated with fentanyl.






Filing of the Lawsuit

- In February, 2017, Erie County was one of the first counties in the United States to file a lawsuit against pharmaceutical companies and distributors for the harm they caused by creating the opioid epidemic.
- A national settlement of all lawsuits was recently entered into by most of the major pharmaceutical companies and distributors.
- As a result of the settlement of the lawsuit, Erie County is scheduled to receive a total of \$63,235,507.34 by 2038.
- That figure does <u>not</u> include the settlement from Purdue Pharma, the maker of OxyContin, who reached a deal in March with a group of attorneys general to pay up to \$6 billion in cash nationwide. We hope to learn more about the details of that settlement soon.











Erie County Opioid Settlement Funding Updates

Media, Marketing and Harm Reduction RFP – released and grantee identified, resolution sent to legislature for approval to contract

Community Education RFP – Currently reviewing applications, will be releasing a second round ir 2024



NYS Opioid Settlement Advisory Board

- Providing recommendations of funding allocations of settlement dollars in an advisory capacity to NYS government departments working in the SUD arena
- OASAS is the lead at the state level
- DOH, OMH and OASAS have been charged with working collaboratively to implement funding recommendations
- Meet monthly now, open meetings
