

2012 – 2025* Number of Overdose Related Deaths Erie County




- 204 total as of 10/24/2025
 - 152 suspected opioid related
 - 117 confirmed opioid related
 - 35 waiting for toxicology
 - 53 confirmed non-opioid related

Race Distribution of Erie County




- Black population disproportionately affected by overdose deaths

 - Erie County population = 12.9% Black



Race Distribution of Overdose Deaths October 2024 - September 2025









- Black population disproportionately affected by overdose deaths

 - Disparity beginning to shrink

















 Ages 40-49 most disproportionately affected


Year-over-Year












- Deaths related to opioids + cocaine
 - 58% in 2023, fell to 39% in August 2024 July 2025






Summer 2024: Sudden shift in toxicology among Black overdose deaths

- Decrease in fentanyl + cocaine deaths
- Increase in deaths related to cocaine w/o fentanyl
- Coincides with beginning of decrease in Black population-adjusted deaths




- Cocaine deaths w/o fentanyl increased more among Black population compared to White population
- Shift occurred abruptly in mid-2024

 - More deaths related to cocaine w/o fentanyl than related to both cocaine and fentanyl












12 Month-ending Provisional Number and Percent Change of Drug Overdose Deaths

Erie County Monthly Overdose Deaths, 12-Month Moving Average



Comparison to State Trends

- As of September 2025:
 - Average of 21 deaths per month over past 12 months
 - 38% decrease in monthly deaths, Yearover-Year
 - Caught up to statewide trend




Non-Fatal Overdose Reports 2022 - Present

Data based on police reports complied by High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Office (HIDTA) and tabulated by Office of Harm Reduction (OHR)




Non-Fatal Overdoses, 2022 to Present



- OHR receives OD reports daily from HIDTA
 - Aggregated from law enforcement reports and EMS calls
 - Used for follow-up after OD and planning outreach
- Not all overdoses are reported



Non-Fatal Overdoses, 2022 to Present



- Typically, 2-3 non-fatal reports per day
- Trending towards 3 reports per day in recent months
- OD deaths are down, but nonfatal reports remain steady




Substance Detections among CPS Drug Seizures by Month


- o 79 samples analyzed so far in 2025

Substance Detections among CPS Drug Seizures by Month








OD Deaths vs Non-Fatal Reports

Overdose Deaths by ZIP Code April 2025 - September 2025




- We typically see more nonfatal OD reports than OD deaths in each ZIP
- If ZIP OD deaths exceed nonfatal reports, cause for concern
 - Potential indicator of under-reporting

Summary

- OD deaths continue to decline
- Disparities by race/ethnicity still significant, but decreasing rapidly
- Recent increase in deaths related to both cocaine + fentanyl, but below 2023 and 2024 levels
- High concentration of deaths in 14215, 14201, and 14224
- Decreasing OD deaths in 14150, 14210, and 14220
- More deaths than expected in West Seneca (14224), Hamburg (14075) and East Side of Buffalo

- Q: What is causing the decrease in racial disparities among overdose deaths?
 - A: We can't say for sure what the cause is. The correlation between decreasing fentanyl + cocaine deaths, decreasing overall deaths, and the shift in toxicology when stratified by race, all beginning around the same time in mid-2024, suggests it could be a change in the drug supply. It is unlikely to be due to a mass change in behavioral factors, considering the level of non-fatal overdose reporting remains fairly consistent.
