






FOCUS GROUP PARTICIPANTS

ECOHE conducted 14 focus groups throughout the county with 97 community members participating.

 - Discussion was recorded









- Group Facilitation
 - Each group was asked a standardized set of questions
 - If there was time, the groups were asked 1 or 2 questions that were specifically tailored to each group













- Data Analysis
 - Recordings were transcribed and edited in Nvivo 14
 - Comments were coded in Nvivo 14
 - 6 SDOH domains and subdomains
 - Other themes that arose
 - Challenges and assets










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

Economic Stability

Challenges discussed related to Economic Stability included:

- Ineligibility for government assistance while trying to achieve stability
- Challenges due to inflation
- Taking desperate measures such as getting involved in crime, working multiple jobs, staying with abusive partners, and asking family or friends for help in order to make ends meet

"Inflation right now, right? I think [...] everyone is struggling. I mean, I'm struggling and I'm a single parent, you know? And I have a decent job and I'm still struggling."



Neighborhood and Built Environment - Transportation

Challenges discussed related to Transportation included:

- Cost of fuel and car maintenance as well as cost of ridesharing
- Limited bus routes and schedules
- Feeling unsafe on public transportation

"It's impossible to get anywhere. You can't take the bus system to town. I had to move to the city for my services to decrease my travel costs. I could never take the bus because it didn't exist in a way I could take it here."



Health Care System

Positive comments related to health care included:

- Feelings of gratitude for having insurance
- Access to a particular health care facility or certain types of care that are not available in other areas

Challenges expressed related to health care included:

- Inadequate health insurance
- Lack of competence in the medical treatment of the LGBTQ+ community
- Lack of available care for certain needs, such as mental health, developmental screenings, and interpreter services







Health Care System

"But I will say that at least Children's Hospital where I had both of my kids here- great service! It was different from what I've watched my family go through In New York City and hospitals there where they're just overwhemed."

"I got a friend. He was 44. He just died. He had a heart attack 2 weeks ago. He did not have health insurance, so he didn't go to the doctor. [...] [He had] a full-time job, but not enough to afford the health insurance."



- Financial planning and management



Concerns about Discrimination or Being Misunderstood

were discussed in the context of:

- Health care;
- Criminal justice;
- Employment;
- Housing; and more.

And on the basis of:

- Race, ethnicity, and culture;
- Gender;
- Sexual orientation;
- Age;
- Place of residence; and more.

"Sometimes people act like you don't know what you're doing.

[They act] like Black fathers don't exist and actually want to be a part of their child life and actually do they job."






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Social and Community Context - Social Support and Influences

Social and Community Context - Social Support and Influences

Positive comments related to Social Support and Influences included:

- Feelings of gratitude for having people to rely on for practical or emotional support
- Being able to trust others in the community
- Being around people who are relatable

Challenges expressed related to Social Support and Influences varied by focus group and included:

- Feelings of loneliness due to geographic isolation without reliable transportation
- Lack of acceptance by family and peers
- Negative peer pressure





Social and Community Context - Social Support and Influences

"One thing is we do kind of pull together, though, and like, we have our small community that we rely on our neighbors and can rely on our churches. And we try to help each other the best we can."

"Some folks have literally no one and they just rely on their friendstheir LGBTQ+ friends- for that support, or for finances, for assistance, for guidance."



Language Access - Access to Information

Challenges discussed related to Access to Information include:

- Lack of awareness of resources due to inadequate means of communication
- The digital dominance of advertisements for community events and resources while some individuals do not have the skills, equipment, or quality internet necessary to access it

"Communication [...] has gotten to the point where it's very difficult because everyone assumes that you go to Facebook and you go to all [the others]. And I hate to tell you, I swear that at least 60% of the seniors do not go to computers in any way, shape, or form. [...] There's no communication available in this community anymore."





SDOH Relationships Discussed in the Incarcerated Men Focus Group










Focus Group Summaries - Wish Lists


