

2025 Overdose Deaths

- 216 total as of 11/07/2025
 - 154 suspected opioid related
 - 123 confirmed opioid related
 - 31 waiting for toxicology
 - 62 confirmed non-opioid related




12 Month-ending Provisional Number and Percent Change of Drug Overdose Deaths

Erie County Monthly Overdose Deaths, 12-Month Moving Average






Comparison to State Trends


- As of October 2025:
 - Average of 21 deaths per month over past 12 months
 - 38% decrease in monthly deaths, Year-over-Year
 - Caught up to statewide trend
 - Continuous decline since mid-2024, shows signs of slowing

Erie County Monthly Overdose Deaths, 12-Month Moving Average










- Black population disproportionately affected by overdose deaths
- Disparity beginning to shrink
 - August 2023 July 2024(Orange) = peak of disparity
 - 35% Black
- Overdose deaths in past 12 months (Red) = 22.7% Black

 % of Population









- Population adjustment allows us to better see disparities

- Black: 54% decrease


- Hispanic: 31% decrease





Opioid-related overdose deaths

- Disparities closing faster for Black population
- Hispanic population is now most affected by opioid OD's compared to other groups






- July 2024






- January 2025















Non-Opioid Death Demographics






- Ages 50-59 most affected

 - Ages 60 and older saw significant decrease beginning November 2024








Substances Detected among Overdose Deaths 2023




- Deaths related to opioids + cocaine
 - 58% in 2023, fell to 37% in September 2024 August 2025

Substances Detected among Overdose Deaths September 2024 - August 2025




















Demographic Trends in Toxicology




- Cocaine deaths w/o fentanyl increased more among Black population compared to White population
- Shift occurred abruptly in mid-2024

Demographic Trends in Toxicology




- Cocaine deaths in absence of fentanyl are mostly age 50 and older
 - At least 50% in all quarters except 2 from 2022 June 2025




Non-Fatal Overdose Reports 2022 - Present

Data based on police reports complied by High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Office (HIDTA) and tabulated by Office of Harm Reduction (OHR)

OHR receives OD reports daily from HIDTA

- Aggregated from law enforcement reports and EMS calls
- Used for follow-up after OD and planning outreach

Not all overdoses are reported

30-Day Average Non-Fatal Overdose Reports per Day, 2022 - Present




Typically, 2-3 non-fatal reports per day

OD deaths are down, but nonfatal reports remain steady




- We typically see more nonfatal OD reports than OD deaths in each ZIP
- If ZIP OD deaths exceed nonfatal reports, cause for concern
 - Potential indicator of under-reporting

More deaths than expected:

- High concern
 - East Side
 - 14215, 14212
 - West Seneca (14224)
 - Hamburg (14075)
- Moderate concern
 - 14216 (North Buffalo)
 - 14211 (East Side)
 - 14220 (South Buffalo)

Fewer non-fatal reports than expected given number of OD deaths

Summary

- OD deaths continue to decline, but non-fatal reports remain relatively steady
- Disparities by race/ethnicity still significant, but decreasing
 - Remain large for non-opioid related deaths
 - Opioid-related OD's now have most disproportionate impact on Hispanic population
- Age profile of deaths differs by substance
 - Non-opioid deaths are predominantly age 50-59
 - Opioid-related deaths are predominantly 40-49
- High concentration of deaths in 14215, 14201, and 14224
- Decreasing OD deaths in 14150, 14201, 14206, and 14211
- More deaths than expected in West Seneca (14224), Hamburg (14075) and East Side of Buffalo (14215, 14212)
 - 14216 (North Buffalo) emerging as area of concern
